New Business:

- 1) Superintendent's Address (Murray Marran):
- Audit is being conducted for inclusive services Special Education. Complex needs continue to grow.
- Fatima EA Advisory group we were able to voice our concerns and give input. How they meet with teachers and deal with students and see where this can go in the future.

 Board meeting – Passed board audit with flying colours. Will be uploading budget to Alberta Education. Finished educational results review.

2) Trustee's Message (Joy McGregor):

- Met with Minister of Mental Health and Addictions. Met with Minister of Education as well.
- Learned different ways to use MLA's regarding mental health and addictions.
- Governance and planning lobbying will be done regarding vaping. Met with Tobacco and Vaping task force.
- January is smoking cessation/addictions month In the third week of January, Treena Napier with AHS (Addictions and Mental Health) can do a presentation with teachers and parents, not with students.
- We could invite her to speak at the January School Council meeting.
- Zonic nicotine pouches have now been approved by Health Canada as well as 20 other similar products.
- Consider having parent volunteers in the washrooms to monitor vaping behaviours.
- School board gave a proposal to Mental Health and Addictions and was told they would have an answer in January.
- Joy attended the parent-teacher-interviews at the elementary schools. Joy asked administration if they would like the board to attend RMS parent-teacher-interviews. Kris said they would like them to attend.

3) School Report – Please see attached 'RMSS November School Updates.'

- Snack bins utilized a lot Joy said there are additional funds for more snacks
- School-wide blitz on Addiction Kris to look into grades 7 and 8 joining this next time.
- Kris Grad update First Fundraiser complete. Goal is "No student left behind" the idea is that no one will have to pay to attend grad.
 - o Bottle Fundraiser raised \$3500 for grad.
 - Grad committee 22 kids on committee very motivated group. Their focus is selling a grad hoodie.
 - Tomorrow night is the first official grad parent meeting. Parents will continue this after the first meeting.

4) RMSS Attendance Policy Update

Kris – Thank you to all the parents and board for putting this all together.

- November 15th was the date of the implementation of this policy.
- Informed students of policy Gave 4 main points for students to be aware of. All students were shown a slide show of these 4 points.
- Kris working with secretaries to enforce the policy.
- Pulling data at end of November to assess the effectiveness of the policy.
- Kris Looking into giving awards for attendance. Also, celebrating where we are at. For example, if we were to have a 95% attendance rate.
- Murray Asking about how cell phone policy is going. Students are using their phones less in the classroom. Students are also not disputing their phones being take away as they were before.

5) RMSS AERR Data (Annual Education Results Report)

- Murray Parents get a survey (as well as students and teachers) Soft data Student engagement, citizenship, education quality, welcoming, caring, respectful, and safe learning, access to supports and services and parental involvement.
- Next page is the statistics of 3- year completion rate and PAT scores.
- Kris on soft data RMS is overall lower than the division and Alberta.
- Kris on hard data RMS is higher than the division but still below the province.
- Grade 4, 7 and 10 parents are asked to complete this survey (Alberta Education Survey). It is filled out within the first three months of the school year. 26 parents filled out the survey out of about 600 students.
- Kris is asking parents what their thoughts are on the report -
 - O Clearer communication as to who should complete the survey
 - o Parents would like statistics to continue to improve
 - The look of the survey is clear to understand

6) Parent Teacher Interviews:

- Kris Is the time of the interviews good at 5pm to 7pm? Parents agree it's at a good time.
- What do you want to see for February?
 - o Kathryn suggested a showcase of art projects, shop projects.
 - Carely have a 'passport' where the students get a stamp for each teacher they see.
 - o Entice students to come with selling grad rings, ram merchandise.
 - Marla sell food as a grad fundraiser, hamburgers, chips, pop.

7) Report Cards and Student Portal:

- Kris When parents received the automatic PDF file of report cards sent to email, parents found it much better.
- Using the cell phones to view them made it more difficult.
- Kathryn disappointed with the feedback from the teachers on the report cards. Would like to see some more detailed information pertaining to the child rather than generic info.
- Marla the Catholic school division uses Power School, which is much more user friendly.
 - Joy/Murray Looking into trying to get Power School for RMS.

 - a. Chair Carley Evernden (nominated and accepted)
 - b. Vice-Chair Kathryn Adams (nominated and accepted)
 - c. Secretary Marla Lee (nominated and accepted)
 - -Stewart Adkins brought up needing to get school council information shared with parents better

5) RMSS Attendance Policy - review

- a. Kris shared the school policy
- Explained that coming out of Covid 2 years ago there was a need to make a solid policy for staff, students and parents
- c. Kris wants school council to be aware of this policy and its importance because our goal is to have students in the building
- d. Parents raised a concern about robocalls and their accuracy. Explained they go out 2x per day. If a student arrives late, it's not always changed to present. Sometimes there are errors or a teacher hasn't had time to fix attendance after a student enters in the middle of a lesson
- Carley asked about students that miss a significant amount of school and what happens with them. Kris explained there are different types
 of absences.
- f. Joy brought up concerns with late students that she has noticed when she is present at RMSS. Asked some questions:
 - i. what are the consequences if a student is late?
 - ii. are students allowed to go into class if they are late?
 - iii. teachers shouldn't have to catch up students for walking in late
 - iv. RMSS should have a late policy
 - v. suggested that if students are more than 10 minutes late, they should have to go to an alternative location to learn, can't enter class after a certain amount of time
 - vi. do we have a formula for something like 3 lates = an absence or 3 lates and loss of a lunch hour?
 - Each item was discussed and clarified that we do have a late policy within the attendance policy but we will firm that up and discuss ideas shared at this meeting.
 - Once these items are reviewed and edited, we will share with Kyle to share with the school community
 - Discussed increasing the frequency of robocalls
 - Discussed possible consequences and what could be implemented with the resources we have?

6) RMSS Student Code of Conduct - review

- a. Kris brought forward the Code of Conduct for review & discussion
- b. School plans to update this with staff and students, put it in line with our RAMS values
- c. Discussed definition of bullying, versus mean versus rude
- Question about involving student council in this process, ask SH students questions in their classes (assembly wouldn't give very accurate or open answers)

7) New bus lane, parking and drop off zones - feedback

- Murray brought up holding buses until a certain time before they can depart to alleviate some of the safety issues
- b. Discussed going back to 1 way traffic around the school and reopening gate at the back
- c. There will be a future meeting between school and transportation department to revise bus pick and drop off

8) Vaping:

- a. Trustee McGregor asked if there are consequences for Vaping?
- b. Kris reported we have zero tolerance for vaping as per the Admin Procedure 173
- c. Shared Holy Family news article and how they've eliminated the issue of vaping in their schools with vape detectors
- d. Board is looking into this for all of our schools
- e. Parent question re: education around addictions and trauma, yes this is a part of our health and CALM curriculum

9) Cell phones

- a. Trustee McGregor shared her concerns with students using their phones during class time, has observed this while doing presentations in classrooms, some rooms have strict policies, some do not, it is a major distraction, parents are also an issue because they are sending messages or calling during class time
- Trustee McGregor said the board is considering a division wide policy
- c. Asked about RMSS cell phone policy and consequences, Kris shared RMSS Handbook with Cell Phone and Electronics policy
- d. Discussion re: updating this policy, too many steps and gives students too many chances
- e. Kris will bring this back to the staff for feedback and update
- f. Murray suggested this be done expediently

10) Volleyball

- a. Trustee McGregor contacted by parents concerned about players chosen for the volleyball team
- b. 39 students tried out, many disappointed girls
- c. Trustee McGregor asked if we can prevent students who play outside of school from participating on school teams?
 - i. we are not allowed to prohibit certain students from playing because they have a higher skill level and more opportunities
 - ii. there were multiple adults/staff/coaches who were a part of the team selection process and due diligence was followed (there was no favouritism)
 - iii. students playing ASAA can not play on a private league team at the same time (it doesn't start until after school volleyball season is over)
 - iv. an extra varsity team was creating to allow for more students to participate (so approx. 30 of 39 students are participating)
